The ARRL has finished updating the website follow this procedure to re-gain your access.

1. Go to ARRL.org
2. If it shows you are logged in then log out
3. Refresh the page you should then get the login button press the button it will take you to the login page.
4. On this page in the upper right corner you will see the Register button you will need to use this button to register.
5. Have access to your email account you have registered with the ARRL you will need this when you press the button.
6. Press the register button it will bring up the login page then go to your email it will have a message containing a New PW.
7. Now use the new PW for the login page. You will then be routed to the ARRL Home Page where you will see the login button login with your new PW from the email and you should be set to go. If you want to check your account info hover over your name and click it will take you to the account page to make sure your information is correct. If you want to change your PW in the upper left you will see password click to change.

FCC License Application Fee

FCC \$35 Amateur Application Fee Effective Date Will Be April 19, 2022

The FCC released a [Public Notice](#) on March 23, 2022, stating that the amateur radio application fees, including those associated with Form 605 application filings, would become effective on April 19, 2022. The Federal Communications Commission's authority to impose and collect fees is mandated by Congress.

UPDATED INFORMATION: The \$35 application fee, when it becomes effective on April 19, will apply to new, renewal, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. The fee will be per application processed by the FCC. If the applicant fails to pay within the 10-day window, the application will be dismissed by the FCC. The application will have to be refiled with the FCC which will restart the 10-day window. For examinees, an application can be refiled to the FCC, by the coordinating VEC, at any time before the CSCE expires.

UPDATED INFORMATION: Administrative updates, such as a change of name, mailing or email address, and modification applications to upgrade an amateur radio licensee's operator class*, will be exempt from fees. (*this new information was just confirmed by FCC staff on Tuesday March 29.)

METRO SKYWARN

We have posted the 2022 training schedule! Training will be online again this year. We will be monitoring the pandemic and if it is safe to hold in person training, we will try to offer a couple of classes.

Only 1 session (class) is required for the training.

***One registration per household (i.e. one Zoom license).** *If your household needs to use more than one Zoom license (i.e. multiple computers or tablets), you may sign up for more.

Classes will be 3 hours and ***PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED!** *We will be sending the Zoom and registration links to those who are registered.

***If you did not take training last year, you are due this year.** *If you took a class last year and still want to attend this year, you are welcome to join!

- Please log in 15 minutes before class starts to ensure you can connect. (morning classes begin at 9am, afternoon classes at 1pm, and evening classes at 6:00pm)

- If you are able, please use your computer's audio to connect instead of your phone as we are limited in the number of participants we can have. We will be using Zooms chat for questions and answers instead of verbal questions. At the end of class we will open it up for verbal questions or discussion.

- We recommend you use a computer with speakers so you can view the detailed photos and videos we display. You may not be able to see those details on a tablet or phone. Feel free to hook your device up to your TV!

- Be sure to download Zoom well before class. Go to [Zoom.com](https://zoom.com), then select Resources, then Download Zoom Client. Under Resources, Zoom also offers tutorials and live training sessions on how to use Zoom.

- To help with bandwidth, we ask that you do not use your camera during class.

- Avoid using Wi-Fi and plug directly into your modem to ensure smooth playing of the presentation.

- After class, we will be sending you an email that includes a link for registration. You must complete that within 3 full days after the class in order to get credit. We will send you an updated spotter card once we've updated your registration. Please allow 2 weeks. For spotters who are renewing, both Metro Skywarn and Skywatchers will be renewed. If you are a new spotter, Metro Skywarn will be issuing new spotter ids for those who are amateur radio operators. For those who new spotters and are not amateur radio operators, we are awaiting direction from the NWS.

Winlink Training Net

Starting on April 6, 2022 we will be holding a Winlink training net after our regular Wednesday two meter activity net for persons interested in using the Winlink programs and for ARES members to improve their proficiency in using the tool during emergency communication events. This net will start after completion of the activity and last about an hour.

The net will start on the 147.18 repeater to collect a roster and setup the instructions for the training and practice. We will then move to the MN ARES digital frequency to do the hands on portion of the net. We will be concentrating on point to point communication. Since during most communication emergencies the loss of the internet is very likely the need for P2P is high. During a communications emergency it is all hands on deck so you don't need to be an ARES member to help out. It is easier to learn now than during the emergency. We will be learning how to move traffic via P2P to a local destination or to a gateway station that has internet connectivity. The use of forms and message content is for a different training segment for another time not this net.

Before net time make yourself acquainted with winlink and winlink express. Take time to view the youtube links and install the needed software. We will be using VARA FM during the hands on portion of the nets. The links are provided below. There will be a number of questions that will pop up and we will work through those as the nets go along. As these are training nets hopefully your questions will get answers. As you have heard many times practice make perfection or as us older fellows say "practice helps us remember".
