Minnesota GI Bill and Amateur Radio

The Minnesota GI Bill program provides assistance to eligible Minnesota Veterans, currently serving military, National Guard and Reserve members who served after September 11, 2001, and eligible spouses and dependents up to age 62.

Eligible participants can use the benefit in Higher Education, On-the-job training/Apprenticeship, or License and Certification.

MN GI Bill Eligibility Requirements

- A Veteran who is serving or has served honorably in the U.S. armed forces at any time, or:
- A non-veteran who has served honorably for a total of five credible years or more cumulatively as a member of the Minnesota National Guard or any other active or reserve component of the United States armed forces, and any part of that service occurred on or after September 11, 2001, or:
- A surviving spouse or dependent of a person who has served in the military at any time and who has died or has a 100% VA-determined permanent and total disability as a direct result of military service and eligible to receive federal education benefits under Chapter 33 Fry Scholarship or Chapter 35. Spouse and Dependent applicants must provide a Certificate of Eligibility.
- Minnesota resident see specific program for resident requirements.

According to Charles Egerstrom, a benefits manager at the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs, this benefit includes amateur radio exam and license fees, including the FCC amateur radio license fee for new and renewal licenses. The MDVA will reimburse most educational expenses up to a maximum of \$3000 per year and \$10,000 for a lifetime. Reimbursement can be made up to one (1) year after the date the expense was incurred.

To apply, visit MDVA PROGRAMS & SERVICES PORTAL. You will also need to submit a copy of your FCC amateur radio license and a Form W-9 Request for Taxpayer Identification Number | Internal Revenue Service

For more information, visit Minnesota GI Bill / Minnesota Department of Veteran Affairs or contact your county Veterans Service Office (VSO). If your VSO is not familiar with the eligibility of amateur radio fees, refer them to Mr. Egerstrom at 651-336-2371.

Winlink Training Net

Starting on April 6, 2022 we will be holding a Winlink training net after our regular Wednesday two meter activity net for persons interested in using the Winlink programs and for ARES members to improve their proficiency in using the tool during emergency communication events. This net will start after completion of the activity and last about an hour.

The net will start on the 147.18 repeater to collect a roster and setup the instructions for the training and practice. We will then move to the MN ARES digital frequency to do the hands on portion of the net. We will be concentrating on point to point communication. Since during most communication emergencies the loss of the internet is very likely the need for P2P is high. During a communications emergency it is all hands on deck so you don't need to be an ARES member to help out. It is easier to learn now than during the emergency. We will be learning how to move traffic via P2P to a local destination or to a gateway station that has internet connectivity. The use of forms and message content is for a different training segment for another time not this net.

Before net time make yourself acquainted with winlink and winlink express. Take time to view the youtube links and install the needed software. We will be using VARA FM during the hands on portion of the nets. The links are provided below. There will be a number of questions that will pop up and we will work through those as the nets go along. As these are training nets hopefully your questions will get answers. As you have heard many times practice make perfection or as us older fellows say "practice helps us remember". WCARES Activities This Year

Washington County ARES will be conducting several planned and unplanned activities this year. First, we have a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the City of Lake St. Croix Beach to monitor the flooding of the St. Croix River in their city. This event occurred in the last two weeks in April. WCARES members served over 200 hours in service to the residents of the city by monitoring the rising groundwater and controlling access to the flood zone.

We will also provide communications in and around Park High School in Cottage Grove during the two (2) Radiological Emergency Plan (REP) drills in June in support of the FEMA evaluation of the Prairie Island Nuclear Electric Generating Plant. 
