Operating events provide chances for club members to meet, practice their operating skills and have fun. Our operating events are also good opportunities for members without stations or who are new to the hobby, to gain lots of experience in a fun atmosphere. In each of the events described below, a club lead is identified, so that everyone knows who to contact to offer their help or find out how to participate.

Events scheduled for 2023.... (some more may be added)

Winter Field Day

Designed to encourage emergency communications capabilities during winter months; takes place January 28 and 29 at Fire Station #3 in Cottage Grove. We will attempt to work as many other stations as possible in the 24 hours of the event. Club lead is Dave, KDOI RF.

Minnesota QSO Party

Sponsored by the MWA, this event is an on-the air party, where stations around the country and the world try and work stations in each of Minnesota's counties. Unlike other operating events, this one does not allow club scores nor does it allow member scores to be assigned to a SEMARC entry; takes place February 4th from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM. There will be an intra club scrimmage on this event; let's see which of our members has the highest score for the party! Club lead is Brian, NOBM.

This event requires participants to use their radio direction skills to find hidden transmitters; in the past, there has even been an opportunity for members to hunt the fox using only their cell phones.
