Study group sessions will be held via Zoom meeting, and each session will include practice time as well as review of CW learning resources and various aspects of equipment used by CW operators.

The club hosted several operating events in 2022. Enjoyment was had by all attending, though, as usual, the efforts of a few provided the muscle for most events.

The new year fast approaches and we are soliciting suggestions for operating events in 2023. Presently, we are committed to: Winter Field Day (January); Field Day (June).

One other suggestion has been made that we celebrate the 35th anniversary of the club during the month of May. Presently that event is suggested to be a distributed event, with members of the club operating their home stations using the call WOCGM/35. It also could be a club event at Fire Station #3.

We propose that members operate the Minnesota QSO Party from their home stations in February. Although there is no club category, as in Field Day, there is no reason why we can't have a group effort, perhaps with club bragging rights for the members with the best total scores for the Party. There are many stations who participate in the QSO Parties across the U.S.

With minimal antennas and a 100-watt transceiver, it's possible to work WAS in an eight-hour period.

It seems to me that there is an opportunity for one or more other operating events for the club members to enjoy; maybe one in July and another in August...or one in August and one in September. Maybe POTA, maybe not. Maybe one like we have operated in the past- from the State Capitol, Fleming Field or Mounds Park, maybe not.

Consider what club events you'd like to see and speak with any member of the Board about your recommendations. As always, the monthly member meetings are a great place to discuss operating events, too. Let's generate as much interest and participation as we possibly can and make it EASY for newer hams to gain experience and have some fun. (maybe even at the experience of some of us old-timers!)

Winlink Training Net

Starting on April 6, 2022 we will be holding a Winlink training net after our regular Wednesday two meter activity net for persons interested in using the Winlink programs and for ARES members to improve their proficiency in using the tool during emergency communication events. This net will start after completion of the activity and last about an hour.

The net will start on the 147.18 repeater to collect a roster and setup the instructions for the training and practice. We will then move to the MN ARES digital frequency to do the hands on portion of the net. We will be concentrating on point to point communication. Since during most communication emergencies the loss of the internet is very likely the need for P2P is high. During a communications emergency it is all hands on deck so you don't need to be an ARES member to help out. It is easier to learn now than during the emergency. We will be learning how to move traffic via P2P to a local destination or to a gateway station that has internet connectivity. The use of forms and message content is for a different training segment for another time not this net.

Before net time make yourself acquainted with winlink and winlink express. Take time to view the youtube links and install the needed software. We will be using VARA FM during the hands on portion of the nets. The links are provided below. There will be a number of questions that will pop up and we will work through those as the nets go along. As these are training nets hopefully your questions will get answers. As you have heard many times practice make perfection or as us older fellows say "practice helps us remember". 
