### **Operating Events**

If you haven't "played" in one of our operating events, you've missed great fun and camaraderie. There are several events already planned for 2025.

The year starts with the SEMARC Winter Field Day, January 25th and 26<sup>th</sup>. This FD will be held at Fire Station #3 and all members are encouraged to join in setting up, operating and socializing. The lead for this event is Dave, KD0IRF. If you're interested, give Dave a call early in the new year. Ask him where he needs help and offer to take an operating or logging spot.

Winter Field Day is gaining in popularity, although it is uncertain if it will match Field Day in June, in terms of participation. For those of you who may have forgotten, W0CGM, under KD0IRF's leadership took the club crown for MN in Class 2A. We racked up 803 Qs and a total, point score of 3938. The Lakes Region and Arrowhead clubs trailed behind us with between 400 and 500 Qs. All other clubs, including the Mining/St. Paul Club (in 3A) ranked below us. Mining was the only other MN club in either 2A or 3A who scored more than 3000 points...and they were over 700 points below SEMARC.

The first Saturday in February marks the return of the Minnesota QSO Party. QSO parties are always fun, more enjoyable when everyone else is trying to work Minnesota stations. Last year, we had a spirited intra-club effort in the party. We expect that all SEMARC members will operate from their home stations. The lead for this event is Brian, NOBM. Expect to hear more from him earlier in the new year.

Tentatively, we have scheduled a newly licensed member event for March. It will take place at Fire Station # 3. The intent of the event is to give less experienced members the chance to

operate HF rigs in different modes. We will also hope to have several experienced members present to answer technical questions. I know that, every year, I need to re-familiarize myself with my two-meter handheld. If you're a new member or haven't built up your operating skills, this should be an informative event for you. More to come in the new year.
